Julian Rowe MA

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Brief Biography

My work is informed by the past, which I treat as a kind of attic or dressing-up box - past images, past cultural artefacts, literature, music, historical events. My process is to plunder all these things from the vast storehouse which our culture offers and bring them together in new combinations that I hope have some relevance to the present. The elements I select may be photographs, postcard images, film clips, found objects and occasionally even sounds. It is important that each of these elements makes its own unique contribution to the meaning of the work, and does not just mirror other elements. I particularly like playing with fragments of narrative, where some kind of thread is alluded to but then left incomplete for the viewer to embroider as they wish. Many of my works include painting at some level. While my work is essentially collage, I enjoy the labour and sheer pointlessness of painting. The relationships between painting and photography, and painting and objects, are sub-themes that I often return to.

I studied at Cambridge School of Art in the 1970s, gained BA (1st Class Hons) in Philosophy and Art History with the Open University in 1984, and MA in Fine Art with Distinction from the University for the Creative Arts, Canterbury in 2010. I have exhibited widely in the UK and Europe and undertaken a number of public commissions.
